Know Your Covid-19 Community Level

This resource can guide facility and community decisions about when to apply specific COVID-19 strategies.

Strategies for Everyday Operations

At all times, facilities should keep certain strategies for everyday operations in place.

Enhanced COVID-19 Prevention Strategies

Facilities should maintain the ability to add or remove enhanced COVID-19 prevention strategies based on ongoing risk assessment.

Standard and Modified Quarantine Approaches

When selecting enhanced prevention strategies, facilities should consider their impact on mental health, access to in-person learning (especially for youth populations), and the likelihood of compliance from staff and residents.
